WITNESSES TO CHRIST: PEOPLE FROM HIS PASSION

The season of Lent will soon be here, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. This year for our Wednesday Vespers and Holy Week services we'll be hearing the accounts of several witnesses to Christ as recorded for us in the Gospel of St. John.

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: “Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name” (John 20:30–31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel has been compared to an eagle—an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of life, the resurrection and the life, and the way, the truth, and the life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus *three* times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by *seven* demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for *thirty* pieces of silver).

Please join us for worship as we hear the witness of these people in John's Gospel:

Midweek of Lent 1 (Mar. 9): *Mary, the Sister of Lazarus and Martha*, John 12:1–11

Midweek of Lent 2 (Mar. 16): *Malchus*, John 18:1–11

Midweek of Lent 3 (Mar. 23): *Peter*, John 18:12–27


Midweek of Lent 4 (Mar. 30): *Barabbas*, John 18:33–40



God in Man Made Manifest

The season of Epiphany focuses on how God was made manifest in the flesh of Jesus. The church spends time hearing of the miracles, signs, and wonders of Jesus in the world. And this made plain to all that Jesus really is who He said He was. He is the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, the only begotten Son of the Father, in the flesh. For “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us” (John 1:14).

It is revealed for all the world to see that Jesus is God in the flesh. It is made manifest by His words and His work, by what He said and by what He did. And these belong together, for “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.” Jesus is the Word and will of God in the flesh, that is, He is the walking, talking enactment of God’s Word.

It is no different for us. We are called not just to believe in God in hearts but also to trust in God in word and deed. As James wrote: “But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves” (James 1:22), and again, “What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? ... So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. ... Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. ... For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead” (James 2:14, 17–18, 26).

Our faith is lived out in works for our neighbor. Our trust in the Word and will of God is lived out not in word only but also in deed and in truth. In other words, the Epiphany of the Lord creates in us an epiphany of our faith in our works of obedience to God who commanded them. By this, our faith is made manifest to the world. It is, as Luther wrote of faith:

Faith is a divine work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God (John 1). It kills the old Adam and makes altogether different people, in heart and spirit and mind and powers, and it brings with it the Holy Spirit.

Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. And so it is impossible for it not to do good works incessantly. It does not ask whether there are good works to do, but before the question rises, it has already done them, and is always at the doing of them.

He who does not these works is a faithless man. He gropes and looks about after faith and good works and knows neither what faith is nor what good works are, though he talks and talks, with many words about faith and good works.

Faith is a living, daring confidence in God’s grace, so sure and certain that a man would stake his life on it a thousand times. This confidence in God’s grace and knowledge of it makes men glad and bold and happy in dealing with God and all His creatures. And this is the work of the Holy Spirit in faith. Hence a man is ready and glad, without compulsion, to do good to everyone, to serve everyone, to suffer everything, in love and praise to God, who has shown him this grace.

And thus it is impossible to separate works from faith, quite as impossible as to separate burning and shining from fire. Beware, therefore, of your own false notions and of the idle talkers, who would be wise enough to make decisions about faith and good works, and yet are the greatest fools. (*Preface to the Book of Romans*)

So, then, let our faith be active by God’s power in the Word through the Holy Spirit. And let then our faith be made manifest to the world by what this faith does: serving our neighbor – in church, in the family, and society – with the works of faith in time, talents, and treasures.

Mandie also loves to eat pizza and watch mystery shows. Mandie has been a blessing to Little Blessings Daycare.

Stephanie is working on 7 years at the daycare. She started with the 2-3's and moved to the infant room this last fall. She loves being with all the children. Stephanie is married and has a daughter Harmony and a dog named Loki. In her free time Steph likes to read, color, write and listen to music. Cats and dogs are Steph's favorite animals, while buffalo wings are her favorite food. The colors purple and black are her favorite colors. Steph is a wonderful person who will always come in and fill in for someone missing.

Our newest teacher in the infant room is Cassie. Cassie has been back at the center for one and a half years. She worked at the center for several years and then came back. Cassie can be found helping the boys scouts with her teenage son. Cassie has the love for cats, having three right now. She also loves Peacocks. In Cassie's spare time she likes spending time with her parents, two sisters and son. Pizza and tacos and the color green are some of Cassie's favorites. Cassie has been a big help coming back to the Daycare.

This month the children will be learning about the wind and waves, the Good Samaritan, leaders and Kings, Valentines Day and how special everyone is to Jesus.


With Covid money, the center purchased new chairs for the classrooms. We are now selling our old chairs. If anyone is interested in some little chairs, please let the daycare know.

CHANGING PATHS

January 2022 | Volume 20 Issue 1



Looking back one year ago, we realize that much of this Christmas season was celebrated in similar fashion. There certainly is a time and place for new ideas; but doing things 'like last year' isn't necessarily a bad thing.

Just as a young child can't wait for Christmas to arrive, our collective community can't seem to wait to return to those celebrations of 'old' with gatherings, 100% capacity, fellowship meals, and live presentations. Yet, similar restrictions from a year ago remain and, in the end, it made sense to engage with those around us accordingly.

Christmas always gives us a chance to prepare cookies for distribution to those in our neighborhood whom we see and interact with frequently (1). Talking about culture differences is always an easy topic with our Korean friends and acquaintances, especially in regard to holidays and Christian celebrations in particular. Dee Dee also prepared seasonal treats for the office staff of our partner church body, the Lutheran Church in Korea, which helps us in many ways throughout the year (2).

Our worshipping community at International Lutheran Church (ILC) in Seoul is diverse. And those that make it up are more transient than stable. The end of the year brought some sad goodbyes, including a sendoff for the ambassador from Papua New Guinea who is a member of our partner Lutheran church in that archipelago (3). Some old friends at church remain, however, including these two women who have been consistent attendees of the Women's Bible Study for years (4).





Also at church, we had another opportunity to tell the Good News to and through our Sunday School students (5). The fact that we were not able to perform a traditional 'program' in person (indeed, we are still meeting at least partially online) actually expanded our outreach once again as we worked with local partners to share our online version (with Korean translation) with our Korean counterparts and their churches (6).

In other brief news: Both girls musically performed at school while we were limited to viewing from home (7 and 8). Lily turned 16 (9)! Matt has been able to return to Korean studies while Dee Dee's volunteering with the orphanages is still limited to planning, organizing, and preparing educational kits for the kids. Despite not being able to seat 100% capacity, we regularly welcome new visitors to ILC and continue to enhance our methods of reaching the community through our improving media technology.

During the Advent, Christmas, and New Year seasons, we received your well-wishes and prayers in the form of cards, notes, and emails. We very much feel your faithful support and thank you for remembering us in many ways.

In Asia, we are entering the 'Year of the Tiger' (10) which happens to mark 12 years since we moved from Taiwan to South Korea. God continues to show His gracious mercy to us each and every day. Thank you, again, for your partnership in this ministry. May more people hear and trust in the Good News of our Lord and Savior, Jesus!




