The Distasteful Fruit of the Spirit

Search the internet for images of "Fruit of the Spirit" and you'll be inundated with pictures of tasty fruit. We like the delicious sounding fruit of the Spirit that the Apostle Paul lists for us in Galatians 5 love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

There is, however, a less attractive fruit of the Spirit that another apostle's preaching produced in large quantities one day. It was the day of Pentecost, and it was Peter who preached to a crowd in Jerusalem. The Holy Spirit had just been poured out on the disciples giving them a miraculous gift to speak in languages they had not

previously learned. In his sermon to the mass of people who were amazed by this miracle, Peter convicted them with some of the harshest Law ever preached. They were "cut to the heart" (Acts 2:37) with the truth that they and their leaders had crucified God's Son. Many came to Peter and the rest of the apostles and asked, "Brothers, what shall we do?" And Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins…" (Acts 2:37-38). The fruit of repentance was being worked in their hearts.

The human heart will not, indeed it cannot, repent unless the Holy Spirit produces this fruit. The fruit of repentance does not lend itself to a pretty and colorful picture. It is instead covered in sackcloth and ashes. We avoid this rather distasteful fruit, but we do so to our detriment. Because from repentance flows the joy of salvation—"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit" (Ps 34:18). And Jesus tells us, "…there is joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents" (Lk 15:10).

While you penitently reflect this month on the Fifth Commandment may you know the sweet joy that follows the bitter taste of repentance as the Holy Spirit produces this fruit in you.

God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith. Amen.

The Fifth Commandment You shall not murder.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.

Questions for Self-Reflection:

Have I unjustly taken the life of anyone, born or unborn? Do I treat my own body as a temple of the Holy Spirit, or

- do I hurt or harm it by gluttony, chemical addiction, or other abuse?
- Do I hate anyone, or am I angry with anyone?
- Do I lose my temper or injure my neighbor by thoughts, words, or deeds?
- Do I hold grudges or harbor resentment?

Do I ignore the plight of the helpless, or am I callous toward genuine need?

- Have you hurt or harmed anyone physically, or with your words?
- Have you been angry and/or hateful in thought towards anyone?
- Have you failed or refused to forgive and be reconciled with anyone?
- Have you provoked others to anger or incited hatred? Do you not pray for your enemies?

Have you failed to help your neighbor when you saw a need?

2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 11 LUTHERAN WOMEN IN MISSION FINISH THE JOB MINISTRY IN MISSION, HAITI

\$85,000 Lutheran Women in Mission Providing Physical and Spiritual Care in Haiti The country of Haiti is familiar with disasters of all kinds. An earthquake in 2010 killed almost a quarter million people. Hurricane Matthew blew through in 2016, taking every metal roof from homes and churches with it. As life was getting back to normal two more earthquakes hit regions of the country. Each time a disaster hits, LCMS Disaster Response calls on Ministry in Mission, a Recognized Service Organization (RSO), to assist. Ministry in Mission has been working for 15 years in Haiti and works with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti.

Besides helping in times of disaster, Ministry in Mission has built and supports an orphanage, an eldercare home, and several feeding programs. They coordinate the sponsorship of nearly three hundred students so that they can daily attend school. Now a manmade disaster has immobilized Haiti. Civil unrest and gang violence has taken over a great deal of the country. Currently there is no formal government. Our Christian brothers and sisters are living in fear and losing hope. Despite all this despair, God's light shines through. The money from this grant will be used to finish the churches that were rebuilt or restored after the earthquake of 2021.

Money was allocated for the repair, but inflation has hit, and more money is needed to finish the project. Churches are open for worship but need to be tiled, toilets installed, and electrical wiring completed. There are still supplies that need to be purchased locally as no shipping containers of supplies can enter Haiti. Disaster in Haiti always brings people to Christ. They realize their voodoo gods are not working for them. The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti is building churches with the same structure and painted the same color so when traveling from village to village one sees and recognizes the Lutheran church. Each church is a symbol of the love of Jesus as they struggle through disaster after disaster.

This church in Carrefour Declos was damaged in 2017 from Hurricane Matthew. We repaired it and put on a sturdy roof. In 2021 the earthquake destroyed it again. We were able to salvage the roof but the entire structure including the foundation was not viable. We rebuilt the church but did not have enough money to finish the floor and bathroom.



Prayers for this Mission Grant:

Dear Father in heaven, the Lutheran church members in Haiti struggle daily in ways that we cannot even begin to understand. We ask You to give them hope and encouragement as they face both natural and manmade disasters. You alone have the power to guide the people of Haiti through their time of struggle. Bless the leaders of the congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti as they minister to their members and address their needs. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Dear Jesus, bless the mite offerings that are given to support this grant. May the money finish the needed repairs for churches damaged by an earthquake. Be with the workers as they complete the repairs so that worshippers may gather in a safe structure. The repaired churches will be a place of hope as they deal with the natural and manmade disasters they continually face. We ask that the people in Haiti continue to turn to You in their time of disaster and that they always see You as a beacon of light in their dark world. In Your name we pray. Amen.
