Repentance Brings Healthy Relationships

You may recall our discussion last month about God's gift of contentment. Commandments nine and ten each guard the gift of contentment. The Ninth Commandment zeroes in on our contentment with things or possessions, while the Tenth Commandment sets our focus on relationships.

God's desire is for us to be content in our relationships and with the relationships we see in the lives of others. Interestingly this includes not just people but also any animals with whom God may bless us, hence, the inclusion of "ox or donkey." Though we do well to remember that animals will always have a lower status because of God's created order in which He placed man in dominion over the rest of His creatures and because of God having redeemed us by becoming man through the incarnation of His Son. What this means, practically speaking, is that we should be careful not to value animals over people in our lives. It is good to love and care for animals, but never at the expense of the people God sends into our lives.

This final commandment sets before us the way to have and maintain good relationships. To repent of one's dissatisfaction in a relationship is the first step toward improving that relationship. To be truly contrite is to truly desire to do better. It's to recognize where you have erred in the relationship and to take responsibility for making improvements. To acknowledge where you have done wrong is also necessary so that you might approach the other with a repentant heart and seek his or her forgiveness. Then a broken relationship can begin to heal.

Lastly, take note of how the commandments begin and end with a focus on relationships. Start with the First Commandment and God's desire that you have a relationship with no other god. With your fear, love, and trust placed in Him alone, you will be ready to thank Him for every relationship within which He has placed you and you will seek to honor Him by nurturing those relations. God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith that you may truly be content. Amen.

Am I contentious, or have I encouraged disharmony in my congregation, family, or workplace?

Am I manipulative or controlling? Have I done all I can to mend or strengthen broken relationships?





Kazakh Women and Children Hear the Gospel of Jesus

Kazakhstan is a large landlocked country in central Asia and a former member of the USSR. The population of 20,086,000 is 70% Muslim and about 26% Christian. Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) is working with local churches to serve women and children and uses digital outreach and printed Christian resources to reach the unchurched.

Government restrictions allow spreading the Gospel only through local churches or house churches in small towns. Traditionally the people come from nomadic populations where extreme poverty in remote villages is very common. Women face many challenges due to the economic situation, unemployment, alcoholism, rising food prices, and general religious apathy among the male population.

Gospel proclamation is difficult due to harassment from non-Christian religious authorities and unbelieving family members. LHM-Kazakhstan is one of few Christian organizations that is allowed by the government to share the Gospel throughout the whole country.

The outreach is done primarily through training programs for youth and women church leaders, children's programs and youth programs, holistic ministry, publishing Christian materials in the Kazakh and Russian languages, and digital outreach and online Bible courses. LHM-Kazakhstan broadcasts its Christian radio and television programming on the internet where it is even more widely viewed.

The LHM staff and other Christian women meet with non-Christian women in special classes at churches to study the Bible, pray, share faith, and receive quality Christian materials that are published at the ministry center. The children receive Bible story and activity booklets, and they attend vacation Bible school and Sunday school.

LHM's digital outreach platform for youth, deepens relationships with non- Christians and is a safe place to share the hope in Jesus. LHM-Kazakhstan will expand their Gospel outreach to share the hope and love of Jesus to a country of spiritual and physical poverty.





LWML Mission Grant No. 20 to Lutheran Hour Ministries-Kazakhstan, "Sharing Christ to Women and Children of Kazakhstan," for \$100,000, will be used for direct outreach in local churches, holistic ministry, digital outreach through Thred.asia, and printed Christian resources to reach the unchurched in Kazakhstan where the proclamation of the Gospel is difficult due to harassment by non-Christian religious authorities and unbelieving family members. 
Coming Voter's Meeting (10/27/24)





Service Videos: Volunteers are wanted to help with video livestreams and editing for network airings. This is a great opportunity for adults and youth alike! Training is available by request.


