THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD: THE ORIGINAL SOUNDTRACK

Movies wouldn't be the same without their accompanying music. It sets the tone for the entire film and creates the mood for each scene. When it's well done a listener can relive the movie experience simply by listening to its soundtrack. Two repeated notes that gradually increase in speed can send chills up the spine and create a frightening image of shark's teeth for anyone who's seen the movie "Jaws." And a few notes from the brass section with the booming rhythm of the percussionists can launch a "Star Wars" fan into outer space.

If music can do that with fictional stories, how much greater the impact of music that accompanies real happenings. Even more, the real happenings, not of mere mortals, but of God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth in action to rescue His fallen creation and save sinners.

This Advent, in our Wednesday Vespers, we'll spend time reflecting on the "original soundtrack," of the Nativity of Our Lord. Zechariah, Elizabeth, and Mary will be our featured soloists and on Christmas Eve we'll have a choir of angels. Their songs will not merely retell the history, they will also bring us into the story as God continues His real work in our very midst "for us men and for our salvation" (as we say in the Nicene Creed).

Zechariah's song will lead us to the Lamb of God. Elizabeth will sing God's glory into our presence. Mary's melody will become our own personal song of salvation. And finally, a chorus of the heavenly host will transform the lyrics of our worldly lament into the heavenly anthem of eternal joy.

Join us this Advent as the original soundtrack of the Nativity of Our Lord prepares us to

receive our King.





Healthy Together: Healthy Workers, Healthy Church

Lutheran Family Services, U.S. — \$106,000

God directs the church to care for those He calls to serve in ministry. Church workers and their families regularly face unprecedented stress, challenges, and suffering which affects their physical, psychological, emotional, and spiritual well-being. There is an urgent need for the church to support and care for church workers.

Lutheran Family Services is responding to this need by launching a campaign to fund expansion of their services to support church workers and their families beyond Iowa and into the greater Midwest. These professional services are provided on an ability-to-pay basis through support of individuals and congregations without funding from the Synod or government funding to not limit their Christ-centered ministry.

This grant will help increase their ministry team of masters-level, licensed therapists who will provide marriage and family counseling that is Christ-centered.

Although this grant has been paid in full – we can still offer prayers for their work:

- 1 Lord Jesus, we ask that You provide strength to all church workers and their families. Give them Your love and peace. Give comfort to them and dwell in their hearts. Encourage them with the knowledge that they are never alone because You are with them. Allow them to continue to serve You as they receive help and counseling at this time of their life. The talents You gave them are used to bless the lives of all whom they serve. Continue to watch over them. In Your name. Amen.
- 2 Jesus, thank You for the counselors who are ministering in Your name to church workers and their families who face stress, depression, and loneliness. As they cry out for Christ's healing love, bless Lutheran Family Service (LFS) for providing a safe place for them. We are thankful that LFS provides professional Christian mental health encouragement and guidance. This means pastors remain in the pulpit and continue to proclaim the Gospel. Healthy teachers staff Lutheran Schools which share the Gospel and Christ's love with families. Continue to surround them with Your love and care. In Your name, Amen.


