2025: ANOTHER YEAR OF GRACE

Happy New Year! New year, new opportunities. The sky's the limit. Set your goals. Make your plans. It's going to be great. But...what if it isn't. What if things don't go the way you hoped and dreamed and planned? What if all your hard work doesn't pay off? What if you get sick? What if someone you love dies? What then?

It can be a scary thing to look into the future. No matter how optimistic your outlook, no one truly knows what the future will bring. Which is why it is good to never lose sight of that which is most certainly true: Baby Jesus was born so He could shed His blood for you. He first bled for you at eight days of age when He was circumcised. Three decades later, this Baby, now all grown-up, shed His blood once again for you on the cross. There He showed you your future—a future of living in God's grace. No matter what this coming year brings it will be yet another year of God's grace. It's the unmerited gift of God's forgiveness that you can count on no matter what, because of Jesus' suffering, death, resurrection and ascension. Certain of God's grace you can meet this New Year with sincere repentance for the sins of your past and confident of God's never-failing love for your future.

A 17 th century Slovakian hymn writer understood God's grace well and put it into the poetry passed down to us in our hymn, Now Greet the Swiftly Changing Year (LSB 896). I commend the words of this hymn to you for your prayerful meditation as you greet the year of the Lord 2025.
