

February 2nd, Luke 2:22-32

Jesus Presented at the Temple

²² And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons."

your servant depart in peace, according to your word;

for my eyes have seen your salvation

that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

alight for revelation to the Gentiles,
and for glory to your people Israel."



A WORD FROM PASTOR LICHT FEBRUARY MESSAGE PAGE +

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: 2 preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. 3 For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, 4 and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. 5 As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry. 2 Timothy 4:1-5

Sound doctrine is essential to the Church. So, the Apostle Paul gives a young pastor named Timothy his orders: "Preach the word." He's to stick to that Word of God no matter what pressure the mob may put on him to do otherwise. Mob mentality is a powerful force that can cause rational people to abandon all reason and join in with the crowd no matter how nonsensical the demands and the actions of the masses.

We fool ourselves if we think we're not susceptible to these forces. We are constantly being shaped by the mob that is the culture in which we live, and the power of the mob is only multiplied by such things as social media and the videos and the "influencers" to which we listen. There's no shortage of preachers to scratch our itching ears, who play on the passions of our flesh to lead us off into myths.

Which is why we need the Church. We gather as a little flock to be guarded by the Good Shepherd from the wolves dressed in sheep's clothing that are seeking to devour us. Under the care of the Good Shepherd we are reproved, rebuked, and exhorted with the sound teaching of the Word. It's our only defense and it requires sober-minded endurance.

But that doesn't mean we're a dower gathering that lacks joy. Sound doctrine is filled with joy because it leads us to our Savior. The patient teaching of the Word bubbles over into our singing. And as we sing hymns of sound doctrine we reprove, rebuke, and exhort one another, keeping ourselves from wandering off into myths and setting our eyes and our hearts on the joy of our Savior and His kingdom.

So it is that we will gather, 40 days after Christmas (Feb 2) to rejoice in the sound doctrine of Jesus being presented at the Temple as a 40-day old infant.

We'll sing with joy the truth of this event in Jesus' life and what it means for us with these words:

Jesus, by Your presentation,
When they blessed You, weak and poor,
Make us see Your great salvation,
Seal us with Your promise sure;
And present us in Your glory
To Your Father, cleansed and pure.
("In His Temple Now Behold Him" LSB 519)

May the Lord keep you, "cleansed and pure," by His sound doctrine,





Little Blessings – "Proclaiming the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ to children and their parents through a high quality child care program."

January has been a slow month for the daycare. Getting back into the daycare schedule mode after the holidays has been tough with several of the children being sick. Several of the planned activities have had to be rescheduled since some of the children have been missing several days.

Our classrooms have been completely cleaned many times because of all the illnesses. We are so thankful for having a four minute dishwasher and a large size washer and dryer to accommodate all our items. Cacfp (food nutrition program) 3 year review was done in January. We passed our review with minor changes. Every three years the food nutrition program must do a review on all daycare programs.

Feb. starts off with the Lions organization coming to do eye screening. Every child that is over 6 months old and not already seeing an eye doctor, gets their picture taken of their eyes. The pictures are examined by professionals and results are sent back to the center. In the 20 some years of having the Lions Organization come to perform the testing, the finds have only been wrong for 1 child. If there is anyone in the congregation that has a child over 6 months and would like to have their eyes tested, please let the daycare know and we can schedule them in with our children. They will never turn anyone down.

The center has decided to sell cookies for Valentine's day. We will be having the older children helping make sugar cookies and kiss cookies. The younger children will be decorating plates for the cookies to be on. Order forms are in the church fellowship table and in the daycare office. Please have orders in by February 9 th and cookies will be available for pickup at the church on Friday the 14 th. The proceeds will help with improvements to the daycare.

February 14th, the children will have their Valentine parties. This is always a time the children love to have fun and do things out of the ordinary. It's always interesting to see the different Valentine boxes the children make. The staff and families will be decorating hearts for our next contest. Come back into the daycare hallway and vote on your favorites. There will be one group of hearts from the parents and one group from the staff members. Voting will start on February 16 th and will go through the next week. Come back the following week to see who wins.

The center still has openings for infants. This is the first time in 23 years that we have had openings in the infant room for more than a couple weeks. Having telephone issues I think has hurt the center from filling the openings. If anyone knows of a family that needs infant care, please send them our way.

With spring right around the corner, we will be having school age children during spring break.

God's Word for Central and South American

Missions

Lutheran Heritage Foundation — \$100,000

Lutheran evangelism efforts are being intensified in countries like the Dominican Republic, Chile, and Uruguay. The need for Spanish language Bibles, Luther's Small Catechism, children's materials, devotions, and other resources is continuous. New pastors who are being trained to be missionaries and evangelists need to be equipped with materials that help share the Good News. This grant will provide for the translation and printing costs of approximately 25,000 books by Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF). LHF will distribute the printed books free of charge to people in Central and South America who live from week to week and have little to no savings. Even though economic or political conditions may force missionaries to come and go in these countries, they leave behind the Lutheran books which continue to teach for generations.



Over 435 million people in our world speak Spanish, and many of those men, women and children are still waiting to be introduced to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. One good example: These students of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Uruguay are 80 percent unchurched. LCMS missionary Rev. James Sharp has been thrilled to provide free copies of the Spanish-language A Child's Garden of Bible Stories, which they can take home to share with their siblings and parents.

WE PRAY:

Gracious Lord, thank You for the faithful service of members of the LWML and for their support of the publication and distribution of Christ-centered, printed materials for people in Central and South America. In John 8, Jesus our Savior promised that if we abide in His Word, we will truly be His disciples, and we will know the truth, and the truth will set us free. By the power of the Holy Spirit, create a longing for Your saving Word in the people of Central and South America. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Iowa East District LWML Grants for 2024-2026

At the Convention in June of 2024, one of the mission projects that was selected was: Lutheran Family Service—Preventing Burnout in Lutheran School Teachers with Christ-centered Counseling Resources. A Grant was awarded for \$7500.00.

The money will be used by the Lutheran Family Service Church Worker Wellness counseling team to provide proactive resources as well as crisis response assistance for our teachers and other workers serving in Iowa Lutheran Schools.

Another mission project that received monies through IED LWML Grants is: Eastside Mission, Davenport. The request was related to the vans owned by Eastside Mission – both of which are at least 20 years old. In January, 2023, God blessed Eastside Mission with Pastor Andrew Watkins, so the mission is once again able to provide Word and Sacraments. Worship services are well attended as well as evening ladies' Bible study and confirmation classes. In March, 2023, Pastor Watkins baptized 11 people, two adults and nine children. He is currently meeting with others to lead them to baptism. Having vans in good working condition is not only a safety concern, but also is key to having successful programs at the mission. The grant of \$7500.00 has already been paid by mites given to IED LWML.


Church Administrator Position Available



"I know that God works His greatest good when everything seems to be falling around us," said the Rev. Kevin Loughran, pastor of Grace Lutheran Church, St. Petersburg, Fla. Grace's church and school building suffered significant damage when Hurricane Milton blew through the area on Oct. 9. The very next morning, more than 40 volunteers from the church, school, community and even farther afield arrived to help.

The Winter 2025 issue of *Lutherans Engage the World* highlights a few of the ways that God comes to His people even at their lowest point, whether that's after a natural disaster, while serving time in prison, or while seeking asylum in Germany. 


