³ Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. ⁴ Now the Passover, the feast of the Jews, was at hand. ⁵ Lifting up his eyes, then, and seeing that a large crowd was coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat?" ⁶ He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he would do. ⁷ Philip answered him, "Two hundred denarii^[a] worth of bread would not be enough for each of them to get a little."

⁸ One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, ⁹ "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish, but what are they for so many?" ¹⁰ Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, about five thousand in number.¹¹ Jesus then took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated. So also the fish, as much as they wanted.¹² And when they had eaten their fill, he told his disciples, "Gather up the leftover fragments, that nothing may be lost."¹³ So they gathered them up and filled twelve baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves left by those who had eaten.¹⁴ When the people saw the sign that he had done, they said, "This is indeed the Prophet who is to come into the world!"

A WORD FROM PASTOR LICHT MARCH MESSAGE PAGE 4

Joel 2:12 (ESV)

"Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, With fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;"

There is perhaps no other season of the Church Year that clashes with our culture more than the season of Lent. It seems we're obsessed with happiness. Happiness does not mix well with repentance. In a world focused on self-fulfillment, self-denial feels downright sinful.

Lent brings a cold splash of reality for us. The season begins with Ash Wednesday. Whether you wear a cross of ashes on your forehead or not, the day gets right to the point: "For you are dust and to dust you will return." It wakes us up out of our dream world of endlessly chasing the "better life," avoiding discomfort of any sort and at any cost. The Lord's call to return to Him "with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning" reminds us that in the midst of life we are also in the midst of death,

for that is what our sins have earned for us, no matter how hard we try to run away from that reality.

The cold splash of Lent waking us from our stupor is the splashing of water in the Baptis-

mal font. Here's how Luther describes it in his Small Catechism:

What does such baptizing with water indicate? It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

The Lenten call for repentance is a call to renewal of faith and life in Christ. Yes, it is also about death—the death of the Old Adam in us. And make no mistake about it, he will go under the water kicking and screaming all the way. Triumph over the Old Adam is never the result of human wisdom, reason, strength, or effort. It is always and only the divine work of the Holy Spirit working through the Law and the Gospel. The Law drowns the Old Adam and the Gospel raises us up to new life.

Lent may seem like a real downer of a season, but it is only a downer when you listen to Old Adam screaming such things as—"It's not fair! I have a right to choose my own life! I have a right to be happy at any cost! You can't tell me I'm wrong!" Those are the sounds of the sinner in you being brought to the cross under the Law.

But the joy of Lent also comes at the foot of the cross of Christ. That instrument of death is the fountain and source of forgiveness, life, and salvation. I pray you will avail yourself of the many opportunities being offered this Lent to be awakened to the new life in Christ. Each Sunday in Lent we'll celebrate in a subdued Easter tone during the Divine Service. We will also gather each

Wednesday until Holy Week when we observe Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. All of it will lead us to a great Easter morning victory celebration as we gaze into the empty tomb. Then we will sing along with the Apostle Paul:

"O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" (1 Cor 15:55).

As the Holy Spirit prepares us for this celebration, we are given all that we ask for in our Ash Wednesday collect:

Almighty and everlasting God, You despise nothing You have made and forgive the sins of all who are penitent. Create in us new and contrite hearts that lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness we may receive from You full pardon and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen











The center had their review with the CACFP (food program). Everything looked great with a couple minor changes.

The center will have school age children during Spring break.

We are still looking to register a couple more infants if anyone knows of a family looking for daycare.

Mercy Holistic Ministry, CA — \$100,000

About This Mission Grant: Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) is a Sacramento, California, based organization, established in 2010, that provides dignified holistic services to restore and transform the lives of the homeless community in and around the city. Its ministry partners include various area LCMS congregations. In 2021, MHM purchased a two-stall shower trailer, literally bringing showers and the Gospel to the location of the homeless. Beyond showers, MHM provides personal hygiene kits, haircuts, clean clothing, and food to the people who come. They offer the opportunity to speak with someone who can pray for them, provide active listening, and give referrals to other services, such as shelters. Bibles and prayer books are shared.

This grant will enable MHM to offer an additional day per week of service and to purchase and retrofit a mobile closet trailer for clean clothing and hygiene kit storage. WASHING BY THE WATER AND THE WORD

Iowa East District LWML Grants for 2024-2026

Risen Christ LWML collected mites, with the Monthly Mite collection, and with our meetings during 2024 for a total of \$735.90. Some of this is directed to the Iowa East District LWML. The district approved 13 grant proposals with a total of \$73,500 and in addition, continued scholarships for IDE members in the amount of \$30,000. At the Convention in June of 2024, one of the mission projects that was selected was: Raising Up Future Church Musicians–College Hill Conservatory requested \$2,000. to provide Lutheran liturgy and hymn resources to help support the development of our future and current church musicians. These resources will help get them involved in the musical life of the congregation sooner.

To know more about College Hill Conservatory: an excerpt from their constitution: On behalf of our executive board, I would like to welcome you to the College Hill Music Conservatory! The Conservatory is supported by College Hill Lutheran Church and serves our surrounding community. Our mission is to provide students with the opportunity to further advance their musical abilities in a warm, welcoming, supportive Christian environment. The fundamental purpose of the Conservatory is to provide musical instruction in a private lesson setting.

However, a secondary goal of our organization is to promote the rich heritage of Christian music, especially that of the Lutheran church. Teachers at the Conservatory hope to promote this heritage by assisting students in learning pieces that they can play in their respective churches.

Another mission project that received monies through IED LWML Grants is: King of Kings, Cedar Rapids – Disaster Relief Project. The request for \$7,500 will be used for repair and/or replacement of equipment and the trailer used throughout the U.S. where natural disasters occur. To be efficient in assistance, the team needs to be restocked with safe equipment and supplies. This grant will help the team continue to be Christ's hands and feet in disaster areas, and to share God's love to people affected by disasters.



Specifically, April and her team conduct two community programs in nine northwest Iowa counties: Community Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention (CAPP) and Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP).

CAPP supports and educates Iowa youth by providing sexual health and pregnancy prevention classes for healthy and successful relationships. PREP helps youth build social, emotional, and life skills to develop a positive sense of self and to connect with peers in their community. PREP utilizes the Teen Outreach Program and Wise Guys evidence-based curriculum.


