Jesus Calls the First Disciples

5 On one occasion, while the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, ² and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. 3 Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. 4 And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." 5 And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." 6 And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. 'They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. 8 But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." 9 For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."[a]



Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help and rely on horses, who trust in chariots because they are many and in horsemen because they are very strong, but do not look to the Holy One of Israel or consult the Lord! Isaiah 31:1

As I write this article, the news headlines are filled with stories of fighting in the Middle East. Recent news has also delivered reports of violent protests within our own country. And in a few days our nation will be celebrating Independence Day and the independence our forefathers achieved through war and bloodshed.

It's an interesting juxtaposition. War and violence are never things to be celebrated. And yet war and violence do sometimes result in commendable, even celebratory things. Freedom from tyranny and the resulting freedom to practice our faith, along with the many other freedoms we enjoy in this nation, are worth celebrating. A stop being put to the acquisition of nuclear weapons by a nation under the control of an evil regime that has repeatedly sought to harm our nation and our national interests is certainly commendable.

Could such goals have been achieved without violence and bloodshed? Such debates are worth having and they will keep historians and commentators in business until the day Jesus returns.

In the meantime, where do we turn for our safety and security? That's a question as old as debates over so-called "just wars." But although there may never be a definitive answer to the justification for any one war, we have been given the answer of where to look for our ultimate safety and security—we look to the Lord.

The Old Testament people of Judah had forgotten this and instead decided the war machine of Egypt brought them more security than God. Isaiah and the other prophets repeatedly warned them and called them to turn again to the God who delivers true security by the forgiveness of sins. Sadly, they ignored the warnings and "woe" came down on them through the nation of Babylon, just as Isaiah had said, "Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help."

It's a lesson that's still relevant for us today. Our true safety and security are found in the Lord, not in the strength of our nation's military or the wisdom of our leaders. Even if we were to lose our cherished freedoms or if nuclear weapons were unleashed upon us, we would remain in the security of God's eternal kingdom because the war against sin, death, and the devil was won when "woe" came down upon God's only Son as He hung on the cross. For us, in our place, Jesus stepped into the battle to absorb God's wrath against us because of our sins. In Christ, the victory has been won, and we are secure unto life everlasting.

So, no matter the news headlines, we can celebrate our Lord's Easter triumph and sing:

The pow'rs of death have done their worst, But Christ their legions hath dispersed. Let shouts of holy joy outburst.

Alleluia! (LSB 464:2)



NEEDED: School supplies – our plan is to put together 50 School Kits for Lutheran World Relief. To do this we do need some additional supplies. What we need:






