The Gospel for October



October 5, Luke 17:1-10

Temptations to Sin

17 And he said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin ^[a] are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! ² It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. ^[b] ³ Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, ⁴ and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."

October 12, Luke 17:11-19

Jesus Cleanses Ten Lepers

¹¹ On the way to Jerusalem he was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, ^[a] who stood at a distance ¹³ and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." ¹⁴ When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. ¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; ¹⁶ and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? ¹⁸ Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well." ^[b]

October 19, Luke 18:1-8

The Parable of the Persistent Widow

18 And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. ² He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. ³ And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' ⁴ For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'" ⁶ And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. ⁷ And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? ⁸ I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

October 26, Matthew 11:12-19

Messengers From John the Baptist

¹¹ Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. ¹² From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, ^[d] and the violent take it by force. ¹³ For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, ¹⁴ and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come. ¹⁵ He who has ears to hear, ^[e] let him hear.

¹⁶ "But to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to their playmates,

¹⁷ "'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn.'

¹⁸ For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' ¹⁹ The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is justified by her deeds." ^[f]

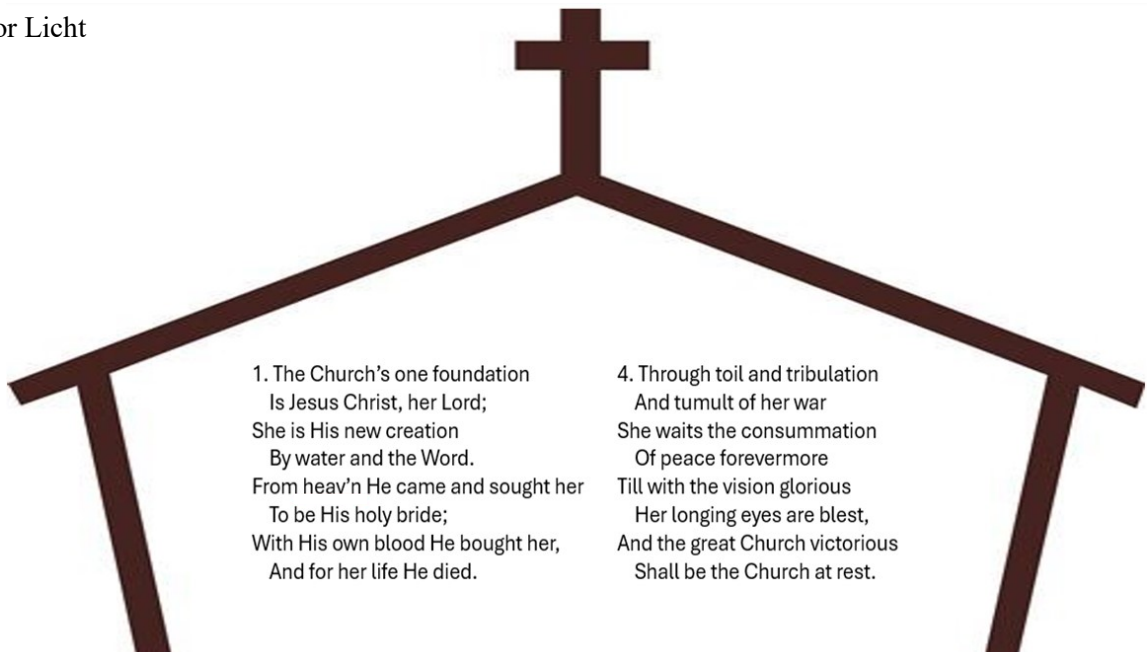
Perhaps recent events have you feeling like we're living in a tinder box that could burst into a raging fire at any minute. Or maybe the news headlines have you thinking the spark has already been struck, the dry kindling is already burning and all we can hope for is that the flames might be contained before they burst into an unstoppable conflagration. Whether you're feeling that way or not, it's always good to remember God's promises for His Church. The world may be ablaze, but the Church will stand. Jesus has promised to be with His Church to the end of the age and that not even the forces of hell itself will overcome her (Mt 16:18; 28:20).

In just a few short weeks we'll be celebrating the Reformation. We'll remember how the tinder box was ignited when a German monk, Martin Luther, called on the Church to return to the truths of Holy Scripture. Luther had hoped for thoughtful, reasoned debate. Instead, he ended up declared an outlaw, and armed conflicts would erupt when those who opposed a church grounded in God's Word alone sought to stop those who were teaching the central message of that Holy Word: salvation by God's grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ Jesus, alone.

Jesus is the Church's foundation that guarantees she will stand no matter the fires that might rage around her. Be it the coals of civil unrest combusting into civil war, or the flare of international conflict bursting into the inferno of a world war, the Church has not, nor will it ever be defeated. In fact, the Church is the only place of safety, the only refuge to which we must flee, if we hope to be protected when the sparks are flying and the fires are raging. And in reality, the fires have not stopped burning since the devil struck his flint against the rock of God's Word with the question, "Did God actually say...?" (Gen 3:1).

In the middle of a world set on fire by sin, God has placed His Church, and in that place of refuge He has put you. Consider the following two stanzas of the great hymn, "The Church's One Foundation" (LSB 644). As you meditate on these words, picture yourself arm-in-arm with Jesus, standing in His Holy Sanctuary, where not even the flames of hell itself can touch a single hair on your head.
