Once again, as God has promised, spring has sprung. I for one am appreciative of the sunshine, warmer temperatures and longer days. And there's much to give thanks for in the spring rains helping to revive my yard after last year's draught. God actually cares about the grass in my yard!

Jesus tells us God *"clothes the grass of the field"* (Mt 6:30). And He goes on to say that if God takes care even of the grass, then we ought to know how much more He'll take care of us. This is why, Jesus teaches, we need not be anxious about our lives—God's got a good handle on how to take care of us and all His creation.

I often will remind people experiencing some illness or injury that God knows how to take care of them. He is, after all, the one who knit them together in their mother's womb (Ps 139:13). What's more, God is also the one who knit together the doctor, the surgeon, the nurse and the entire medical team that He's providing to take care of them.

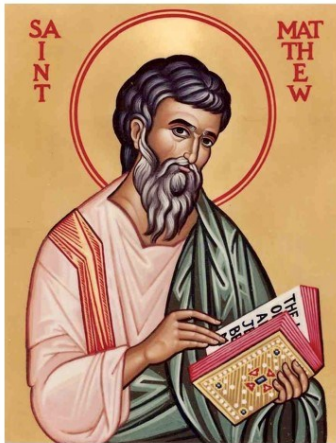
God is so good at taking care of us that He will even knit us back together after our bodies have decayed in the grave. With the blast of a trumpet and the shout of an archangel (1 Thess 4:16), we'll leap up out of our tombs with our new glorified bodies, never to experience sickness or pain ever again.

The grass, the trees, and the flowers all "springing back to life" this time of year point us ahead to that final day. It's a day we can look forward to with great joy and anticipation because God's Son has already "sprung back to life," never to die again. That's the Easter message that sustains us even in the dark days of winter. The Apostle Paul puts it this way, *"He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"* (Rm 8:32).

And *"all things"* includes the kingdom of heaven. God did not hold back His own Son, but gave Him up unto death, so that by the forgiveness of our sins we might become heirs of God's kingdom.

So, even if the springtime pollen count is wreaking havoc with your sinuses, give thanks for another spring. It's all in the hands of our good and loving Creator. God knows how to take care of you, from cradle to grave and out again unto life everlasting.

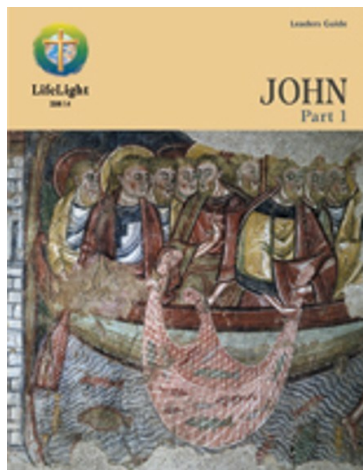

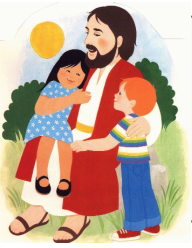

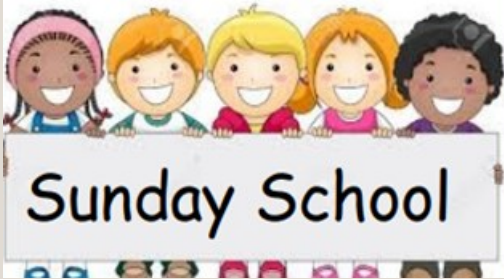
We wanted to thank Jessica Welch for organizing the Blood Drive, the Daycare received a donation that we're very thankful for and we will find something awesome to buy with it.

Lutheran Counseling and Family Services of Wisconsin—\$100,000

About This Mission Grant

Protecting and nourishing the mental health and well-being of children is the mission of Lutheran Counseling and Family Services of Wisconsin (LCFS). They protect a child's integrity, self-worth, spiritual well-being, and mental health through professional compassionate Christian counseling.

The outpatient child therapy clinic was expanded in August 2023 and the number of children served by LCFS grew beyond capacity in six months. The clinic needs to expand its services again to meet the demands and needs of countless children in the greater Milwaukee community.

As children get better and stronger, the lives of parents, siblings, and other family members often improve. LCFS also deploys trained therapists to respond to community crises and offer Christ's healing.

This grant will increase the number of therapists working in the clinic from five to seven, purchase therapeutic toys, and develop promotional materials to present to LCMS churches and groups.

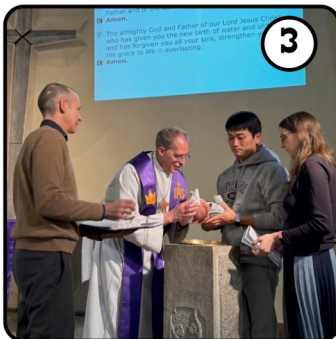

Preparing ministry updates, such as this edition of *Changing Paths*, doesn't necessarily mean 'new' ministry. We have learned that consistency, patience, and trust are vital in church work, just as they are in most other relationships. Though many of the photos you see here may look familiar to previous issues, we are thankful the Lord continues to open up these avenues of service and involvement for the sake of His mission. Last month, Dee Dee joined other missionaries from the region in a thoughtfully-planned event that gave these multi-talented women an opportunity to learn, grow, and reflect together while strengthening their bonds of friendship and encouraging each other (1). Olivia, in the midst of her busy last semester of high school, organized a note-writing activity at her high school in order to encourage children who live at a welfare home (2). International Lutheran Church continued its growth as new families come to the church and bring their



children to the waters of Baptism (3). As a family, we help organize and facilitate monthly fellowship events, such as this Chili Luncheon, that are important keys to the culture and life of this special church community (4).

WASMUND FAMILY UPDATE

Investing time in the planning and production of teaching materials for the children of the church is a highlight of our week. Having completed a study of all 39 books of the Old Testament including memory verses for each book, we celebrated with a special full review and tea party for all



the students (5, 6). We have moved into the New Testament and have seen the children grow in their knowledge and confidence in God's Word. Though not all present every single week, ILC currently is home to 20+ children ranging from birth to high school. On the fun, cultural side of life in Seoul, we were able to witness from the periphery the phenomenon of the popularity of a K-Pop group called BTS (7). The free outdoor concert took place close to our home so we ventured out to see how close we could get (not very!) and appreciate the logistical organization and mindful civility of tens of thousands of gathered fans from Korea and around the world. While outside, South Korea's number one heritage site of Namdaemun gleamed in the night to remind us of the ancient and proud history of this place.

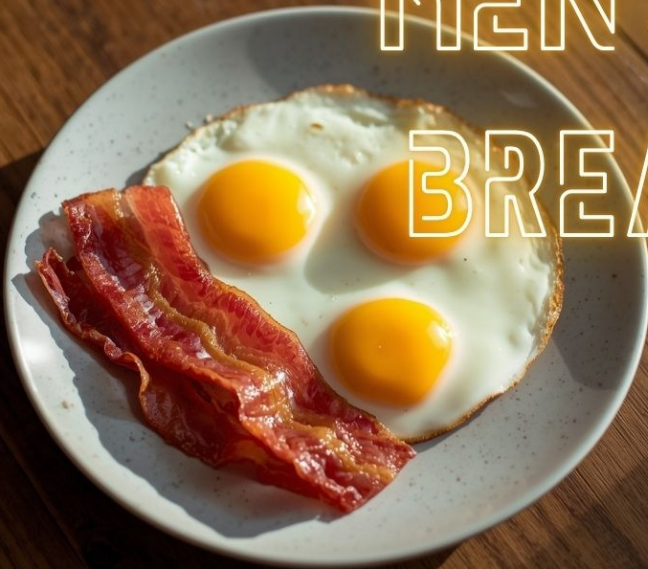

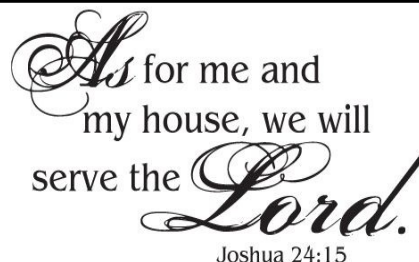
