June 7, Matt. 9:9-13

Jesus Calls Matthew

⁹ As Jesus passed on from there, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him. ¹⁰ And as Jesus^[a] reclined at table in the house, behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and were reclining with Jesus and his disciples. ¹¹ And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" ¹² But when he heard it, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³ Go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' The Harvest is Plentiful, the Laborers Few

Have No Fear

²⁶ "So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. ²⁷ What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. ²⁸ And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell.^[a] ²⁹ Are not two sparrows sold for a penny?^[a] And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. ³⁰ But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. ³¹ Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. ³² So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, ³³ but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven. *Matt. 10: 26-33*

June 28, Matt. 10:34-42

Not Peace, but a Sword

³⁴ "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword...³⁸ And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. ³⁹ Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. *Matt. 10:34, 38-39*

The Creator of the universe loves to hear our prayers. In fact, He loves so much to hear our prayers that He commands us to pray! So, consider the precious jewel found in the following passage:

*Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise. "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. "And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. **James 5:13-16***

In times of suffering and in times of cheer, **God wants to hear from us.** And when we're sick, He wants to hear **not only from us but from the whole church.** He directs us specifically to our pastors for this praying ("elder" is one of the names for a pastor used in the New Testament). Pastors are tasked by God with praying for their congregation and leading the people in prayer. The Epistle of James admonishes us to not overlook the gift of a pastor and a congregation that will pray for us in our hour of need.

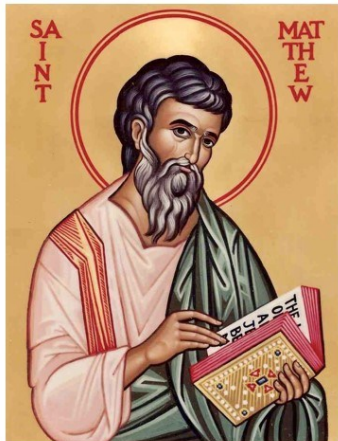
What's more, James reminds us of an ancient custom—anointing with oil (see also Mark 6:13). Oil was often used in the Old Testament to mark a person as being set apart for a specific purpose and as a recipient of God's blessing (see especially Ps 23:5 and Ps 92:10). How wonderful to be prayed over by your pastor (and perhaps others in the congregation) and receive at the same time an anointing with oil to specifically designate you as the intended recipient of the blessings (healing, strength, peace, etc.) for which the Lord is being petitioned. And don't worry, the oil won't leave you with a greasy head of hair or ruin your clothes. Only a small amount is used to mark your forehead with the sign of the cross. Hmm...that sounds a bit like these words from our baptism liturgy: "Receive the sign of the cross...upon your forehead...to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified."



Yes, you've been anointed already with the waters of Holy Baptism. Through those sin-forgiving, life-giving waters you have been set apart as one who has been rescued, born again as a child of God. Baptism is the foundation. The custom of anointing the sick with oil follows as a joyful reminder of how much our heavenly Father loves to hear from His children and answer their prayers.

If you would like to be prayed over by your pastor (with or without anointing oil) let me know. Your board of elders would be happy to join us for a time of prayer, or we can meet privately if you'd prefer. Or perhaps there are some other brothers and sisters in Christ you'd like to be present. Call, text, or email me and let's rejoice together in our God who loves to hear and answer our prayers.

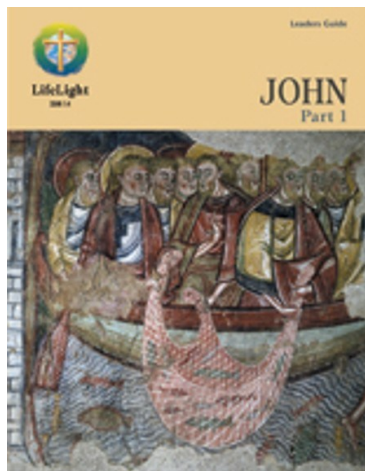

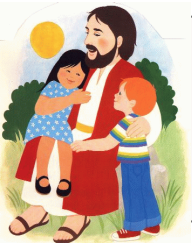

The Daycare is getting ready for Summer!! The school-age children will be here the 1st week of June. The 2nd week we will be joining in on VBS. Our children always enjoy this week; there's so much to do and learn. We want to thank Ms. Leslie for always working with us and including our Daycare children and going above and beyond for the church in her work for Children's Ministries. The Daycare teachers and children will miss her next year. This year for one of our stay-trips, we are having a portable barnyard the last day of VBS. VBS kids and daycare children will both be participating in this activity. The Barnyard will be a small petting zoo that will have a cow, horse, ducks, and chickens. It will also have items to teach the children about farming. We have a few Stay-trips planned with the School-Age children this summer and are very excited. We'll keep you posted...

Our Family Night went well for our first go. We would love to plan another soon. We gathered our Daycare families and teachers and had the Board join us for dinner, movie, and games. We had about 10 daycare families plus employee families. Ms. Joyce led us in prayer. All the families had a positive response. Hopefully next time we can get a few more to join.

Daycare is getting new flooring in the office—it sounds like it's still the original carpet from when the center first opened. We have been filling the hallways with all our craft supplies and furniture, so once that's finished, we will be putting it all back. I would like to thank Allan for helping us get the cupboards out. The Infant and Toddler rooms for new gates for the doors. Daycare would like to thank Dave for putting those in.

Our lessons for this month: June 1-5 Lydia sells purple cloth (Acts 16:14); June 8-12 Wind and Fire (Pentecost; Acts 2:4); June 15-19 Lost Son—Parable (Father's Day; Luke 15:20); June 22-28 Lame Beggar Healed (Acts 3:8).

The Daycare Center is also working on IQ4K (Iowa Quality for Kids). This is a quality rating scale for childcare centers. Programs that participate in the IQ4K are committed to the highest standards and are working to provide the best care possible. We are starting with Level 1 (out of 5 possible levels). We are working with our Childcare Resource & Referral consultant very closely to help us in completing this. By doing so, it opens new opportunities for the center and daycare staff. An example is education staff would be able to have help paying tuition for school. The center would also receive increased reimbursement rates for children getting state assistance. This is a great program to be a part of. We are in the second stage of the 3-stage process. The center has been working so hard to complete this process. It's been a 2-year process with extra steam put in this past year to get it completed. The Office would like to thank Grace and Patty for starting the LBDC handbook and for Ms. Liz for finishing the process. This is a very important part of the paperwork, plus all the staff for completing hours of staff training. We can't wait to update you when we have it completed.

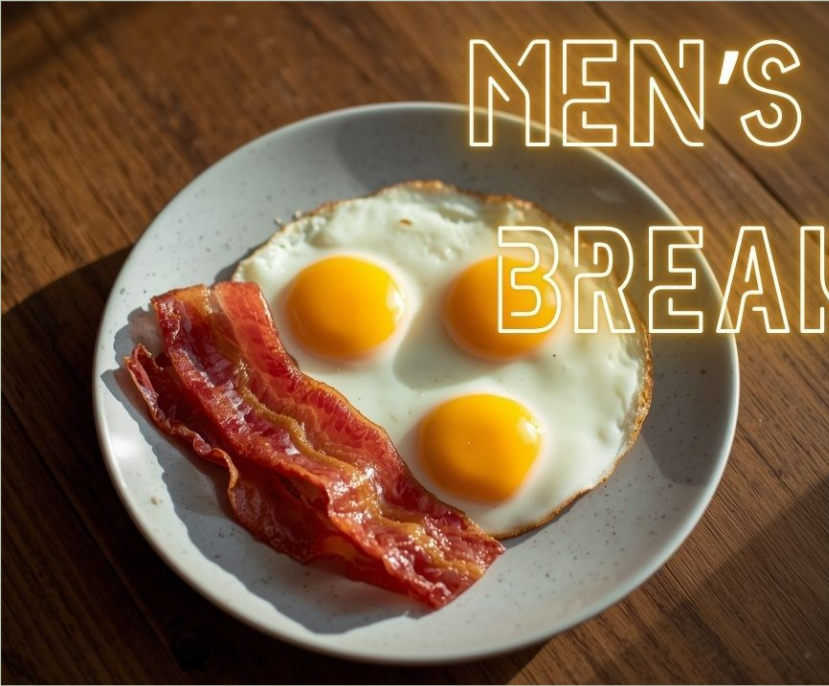

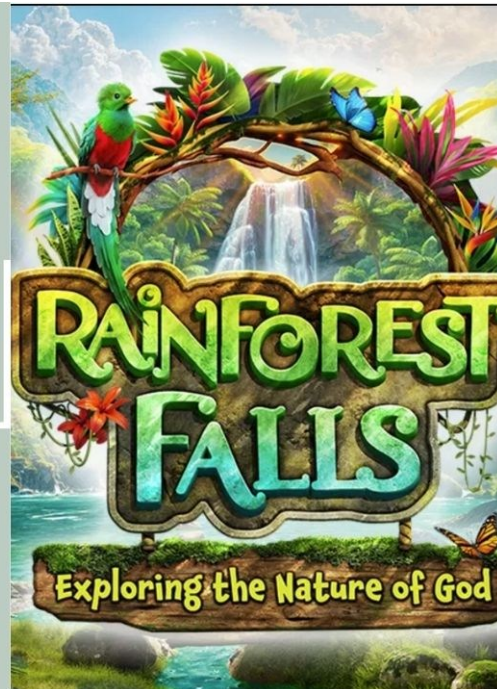
