The Gospel for July



July 5, Matt. 11:25-30

Come to Me, and I Will Give You Rest

²⁵ At that time Jesus declared, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children; ²⁶ yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. ^a ²⁷ All things have been handed over to me by my Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. ²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Parable of the Sower Explained

¹⁸ "Hear then the parable of the sower: ¹⁹ When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is what was sown along the path. ²⁰ As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, ²¹ yet he has no root in himself, but endures for a while, and when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately he falls away. ^a ²² As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. ²³ As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it. He indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty." *Matt. 13:18-23*

The Parable of the Weeds Explained

³⁶ Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples came to him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." ³⁷ He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man. ³⁸ The field is the world, and the good seed is the sons of the kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one, ³⁹ and the enemy who sowed them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. ⁴⁰ Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. ⁴¹ The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will gather out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all law-breakers, ⁴² and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. ⁴³ Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear." *Matt. 13: 36-43*

July 26, Matt. 13:44-52

The Parable of Hidden Treasure, The Parable of the Pearl of Great Value

⁴⁴ "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. ⁴⁵ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, ⁴⁶ who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it." *Matt. 13:44-46*

The Creator of the universe loves to hear our prayers. In fact, He loves so much to hear our prayers that He commands us to pray! So, consider the precious jewel found in the following passage:

*[Jesus said,]
Pray then like this:
“Our Father in heaven,”*
Matthew 6:9



The God to whom we pray is God Almighty. The very idea that He would want us to come to Him with our needs is incredible. The thought that the One who holds the universe in His hand will hear our supplications is more than intimidating. We, who often find ourselves tongue tied in the presence of mere mortals, are expected to be able to string together coherent sentences and speak to the King of kings and Lord of lords.

Why then are we not commanded to address Him with the utmost reverence and honor? How could we be so assuming as to speak to Him as “Father”? We can because Jesus has instructed and even commanded us to do so. Even more, Jesus is the One who makes it possible for us to address God in such a familiar and intimate way. By His sacrifice on the cross we’ve been brought into the family. On account of Jesus, *God is our forgiving and loving Father! We assume nothing by addressing Him as our Father because Jesus has assumed all our sin and we have been cleansed by His blood. We now stand pure and holy before our holy Father. We can boldly and confidently speak to God as our loving, heavenly Father because He really is our loving, heavenly Father.*

We are entitled to address God as our Father not because of who we are, but because of the One who is our Brother—the One who would be named Jesus because He would save us from our sin. Because of His saving work we are given to address God, not as my Father, but as our Father. The whole of Christendom, Christians the world over, stand beside us as we pray. It is not merely you, standing isolated and alone before God the Father Almighty. Rather, you stand shoulder to shoulder, united with your brothers and sisters in Christ. No matter how isolated and alone we may feel, our petitions are received together in a grand chorus of voices from the Communion of Saints, falling like beautiful music on the ears of our Father in heaven.

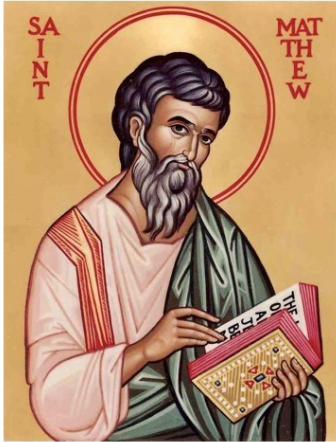
Take time, daily, to meditate on Jesus’ command to pray, saying, “Our Father, who art in heaven.” Ruminates on those words with wonder and awe. Let them sink deeply into your heart and the recesses of your brain, to bring you comfort and confidence in any and all circumstances of life, knowing that God delights to hear your prayers.

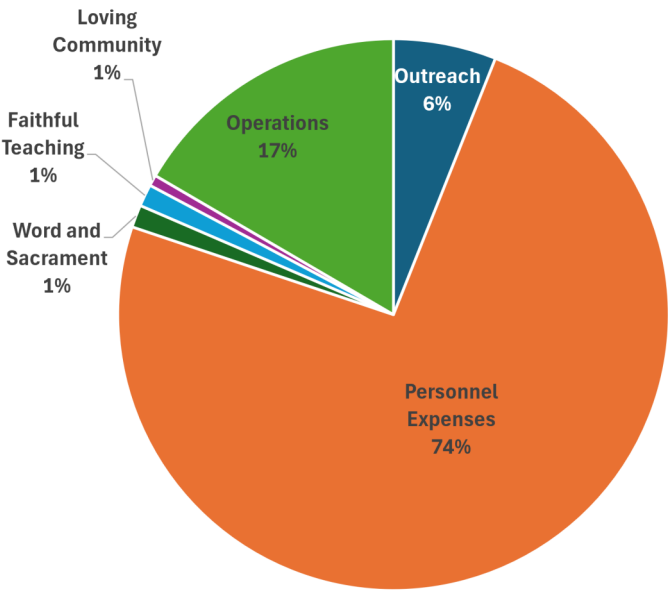

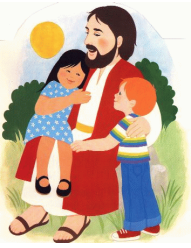

How are contributions to Risen Christ Lutheran Church's General Fund being spent?



Little Blessings Daycare extends the mission of Risen Christ Lutheran Church into the community by proclaiming the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ to children and their parents through a high quality child care program. Little Blessings Daycare Center provides care to approximately 40 daycare children and 30 school-age children annually and employees an average of 20 staff. The daycare operates primarily through tuition revenue received from enrolled families and tuition assistance programs sponsored by the government and non-profit organizations. The congregation supports the Little Blessings Daycare ministry by providing operation space within the church facility and by providing spiritual and operational guidance from Pastor, the Church Administrator and the Little Blessings Daycare Board. The primary additional cost to the church is utilities, historically estimated to be about \$12,000 per year (approximately 4% of the church budget included in building operations expenses).

This past week, we had the QC Botanical Center come to teach us about worms. We learned that worms don't have eyes. They can get very slimy as a defense to keep them safe.

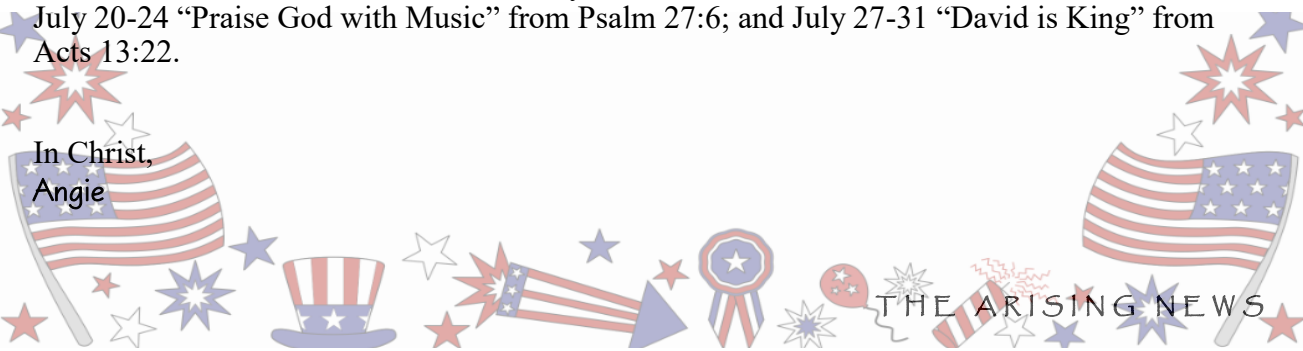

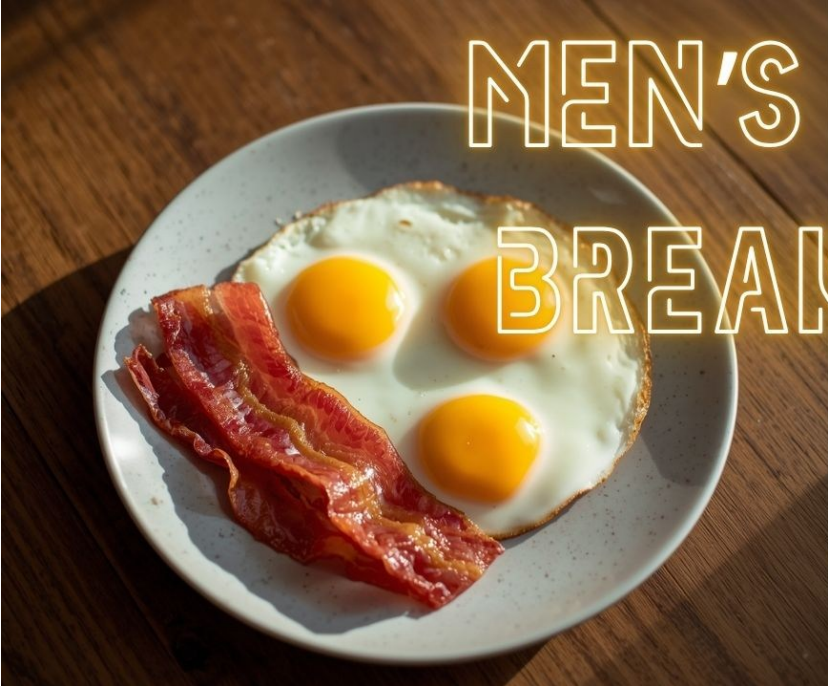
